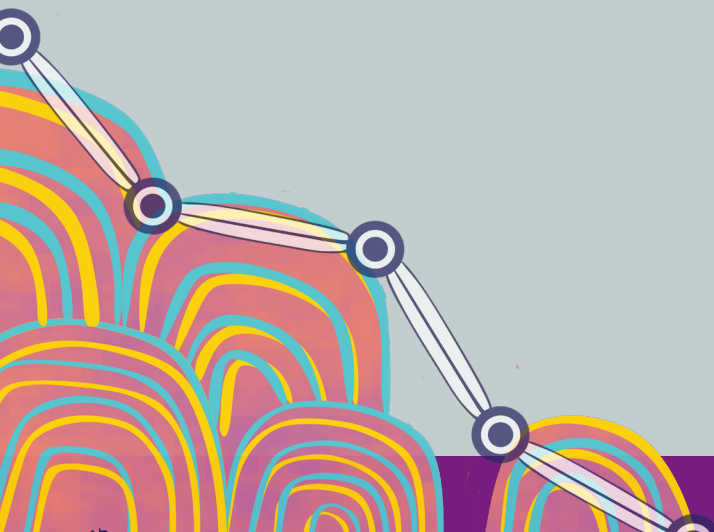

What we do

Bravehearts works to prevent and treat child sexual abuse through:

- Teaching children personal safety skills through our education program, Ditto's Keep Safe Adventure.
- Providing free and accessible resources and information related to the prevention of child sexual abuse to parents and carers.
- Supporting survivors of child sexual abuse and their families with specialist counselling, case management and advocacy.
- Providing child protection training courses for those working with and around children and young people.
- Using evidence-based research to underpin our programs and advocate for legislative reform.
- Breaking the silence around child sexual abuse through community education and public awareness campaigns.

Why we do it

- More than **1 in 4 Australians (28.5%)** have experienced child sexual abuse¹.
- More than **1 in 3 Australian girls** and almost **1 in 5 boys** experience child sexual abuse².
- Among Australian children who have been sexually abused, for **more than three-quarters (78%)**, it happened more than once³.
- In **up to 90%** of child sexual abuse cases, the offender is known to the family⁴.
- In **more than half** of cases (approximately 52%), the onset of child sexual abuse is from 0 to 8 years⁵.
- **1 in 8 children** has sent a photo or video of themselves to someone they first met online⁶.
- Approximately **1 in 3 cases** of child sexual abuse are instigated by other young people⁷.
- **Providing specialist counselling** and support to survivors of child sexual abuse helps **reduce the effects of trauma**, which can include post-traumatic stress disorder, alcohol and substance abuse, eating disorders, self-harm and suicidal ideation.
